Bayshore 5		<p><b>Concurrent Breakout 2a</b>  <b>Like a Bridge over Troubled Water: Dysfunction as a Mechanism for Systematic Change</b>  Speakers: Dr. Jon Hakkila, Associate Provost for International Services, Academic Integrity, Dean of the Graduate School, University of Alabama - Huntsville, and Dr. Troy Terry, Dean of Graduate Studies, University of North Georgia</p> <p>In difficult financial times, a university can underappreciate the need for a functional centralized graduate school by dividing the unit or by reducing funding to the point that it is no longer functional. Cost-saving measures are often regretted after a few years when the inability of other academic units to cover the missing functions is belatedly recognized. We present two case studies of institutions that allowed their centralized graduate school model to either lapse or to become outgrown due to rapid growth, and the efforts needed to restore their functionalities.</p>

Although modern recruitment strategies may still include attending virtual and in-person fairs, this is being replaced by a "digital first" strategy. Digital marketing efforts might include advertising through various platforms, and constant contact with prospects through emails, texts, and social media. The hub of a modern digital recruitment strategy is a Customer Relationship Management (CRM) system.</p>

Despite this limited in-person interaction, they form strong bonds with their faculty and fellow students.</p>
